

Pre-Test Answers Distracted Teen Driving Program

1. Q: Can a parent legally take away the right to drive from a teen driver who is 16-17?
A: Driving is not a right for teens. Parents have the right to withhold or cancel their teen's driving privileges at any time for any reason.
2. Q: What restrictions do 16 year old drivers have? Two part answer.
A: 16 year old drivers are restricted from driving between midnight and 6 am and,
A: They may not have more than one passenger who is not a family member in the vehicle
3. Q: What restrictions do 17 year old drivers have? Two part question.
A: 17 year olds are restricted from driving between 1am and 5 am
A: They may only have as many passengers as seat belts in the vehicle
4. Q: If you are under 18 is it illegal to use any electronic wireless communication device while driving in Ohio? T or F
A: True. It is illegal:
 - a. No texting
 - b. No e-mailing
 - c. No talking on your cell phone, Bluetooth, Bluetooth speakers, On-Star or any similar device
 - d. No computers, laptops or tablets
 - e. No playing video games
 - f. No using GPS (unless it is voice activated or hands free device) even when you are sitting at a light or stuck in traffic

EXCEPTIONS: Pre-programmed GPS. Vehicles in a stationary position and outside a lane of travel, emergency calls to law enforcement, hospital, fire department, etc.
5. Q: Is it a primary offense for driver's under 18?
A: Yes. Law enforcement can stop you for any of the above reasons.
6. Q: If you are 15 ½ with a temporary permit do you need a licensed driver with you?
A: Yes you need a parent, guardian, or certified driving instructor with you at all times
7. Q: What if you are 16 or older?
A: Your licensed driver must be at least 21 years of age or older.
